Mike Nash has a long background in security evaluation criteria. His first involvement came in 1985, working initially within NATO using the US TCSEC 'Orange Book', and then setting up and managing the first UK evaluation facility. He helped develop the UK national criteria, the ITSEC and finally the Common Criteria. On the other side, he also advised major vendors and customers how to prepare for and successfully achieve security evaluation.

Dr. Nash also has a long background in security standards development. He has been the Editor for Part 2 of ISO/IEC 15408, the ISO equivalent of the Common Criteria, since its inception. He helped draft BS 7799, the British precursor to ISO/IEC 27001 and 27002. Somehow he has ended up as one of the Editors of the new series of sector-specific information security management standards, ISO/IEC 27010, dealing with inter-sector communications.
